Even with the Animal Welfare Act 2015 already in force, cruelty against animals still persist and we strongly believe that increased enforcement by the authorities is needed to curb cruelty against animals. I share the same vision with SPCA Selangor in that the introduction of educational programmes and workshops on the Animal Welfare Act 2015 would be an effective way to share knowledge to the younger generation as well as the public at large. SPCA Selangor will continue to promote and prevent cruelty through her education programmes and hopes that doors will open for SPCA Selangor to

reach out to corporates to take an active role in the CSR programmes to promote kindness to animals.

With the recent news in the social media on the catching of strays as well as the conditions of local council pounds and the sad state of conditions that the strays are being exposed to, I trust the authorities will take positive steps to improve the environmental conditions as well as to treat strays more humanely.

I would like to appeal to the public to have a big heart to support SPCA Selangor in her work in animal welfare and also wish to take this opportunity to thank all the donors for their kind contributions and support.

70 billion animals are killed for food every year! Land and food resources used to produce meat are disproportionate to the final protein content and livestock is a major contributor of carbon emissions, amounting to about 14% of all carbon emissions.

Farm animal welfare has long been a concern of mine. While companion animals are visible and play a very important part of our lives, 99% of animals killed (70 billion) are killed for our desire for meat. Imagine the horror and immense institutionalised cruelty than happen behind closed doors, the doors that if we peak through will haunt us forever.

Therefore, I'm happy that with a grant

from Open Wing Alliance, an initiative of The Humane League, we are able to set up a Farm Animal Welfare department, headed by the very capable Ms Wong Ee Lynn. Our first initiative is to focus on humane poultry welfare and the benefits of a plant-based diet.

Humane stray animal control continue with discussions with Municipal Councils and YB Ng Sze Han, Selangor Exco Member and Head of PBTs in Selangor. SPCA Selangor will assist in developing Humane strategies and Proper Pound management in all Selangor pounds. Creating Compassionate Communities, on of SFS goals, will feature strongly in managing spayed/neutered community animals.

FOOD & FUNDS

The E.R.A. Centre uses a mix of commercial dry pellets, canned soft foods and cooked meat and rice for our dogs and cats. Food donations continue to come in, both for Centre use and for our Food Bank that provides pet food rations to community feeders and rescuers. SPAY-NEUTER **PROGRAMME**

e have been running our low-cost, highvolume spay-neuter programme at the E.R.A Centre – providing subsidized spayneuter services for companion animals belonging to people from the lower income category, for animal rescuers and people caring for strays in their communities. Neutering is a proactive measure that stops the overpopulation crisis at source - unlike other shortterm solutions such as dog-catching and euthanasia which are ineffective, expensive and short-sighted. Thousands of stray animals and unwanted litters

face euthanasia or are suffering on the streets, neutering diurectly addresses this overpopulation crisis. Starting from 2 cats, you can end up with as many as 20,000 kittens and cats in a matter of 7 years!

Our neutering program is outsourced to Star Pets and PawsDoc, and we continue to assist rescuers and small Shelters operators through offering an affordable rescue adoption package (neutering, vaccination, parasite control, treatment. education) neutering. Since 2003, we have neutered upwards of 55,000 cats and dogs in the Klang Valley and beyond!

We are pleased to say that the Department of Veterinary Services (DVS) shares our vision of a Stray Free Malaysia, which we can achieve through more effective legislation, active neutering or pets and strays, differential licensing and public education!

This year our focus was on rehabilitation and emergency response. Many animals came in abused, injured and abandoned. These sick, scared and nervous animals have been transformed into healthy happy pets by our dedicated Kennel team, headed by Kennel Manager and Committee Member Ms Nancy Lee.

Adoption has been a struggle, but we practise NO-KILL and all healthy animals will remain until they find loving

homes. Post adoption communication is encouraged to ensure a smooth and transition into their new homes.

The Kennel Team work hard to ensure hygiene in all kennels and ensuring our furry residents are well-fed and well-loved!

n 2019, 46 kittens/cats were fostered by kind and responsible fosterers — and almost all of them have since found loving homes. We are so happy that many of the fosterers offered to continue fostering with us in the future! We struggle with the number of surrendered and dumped kittens, so we are very grateful to our fosterers who open up their hearts and homes to ease our burdens and help us to save more lives.

This year, we have mentioned our cats in quarantine frequently to create more awareness and educate the public

about dumping, the importance of gently surrendering, the needs of a new-born kitten and fostering. We hope that by sharing these short posts, people can personally relate to these cats/ kittens:

The Paw Park is a built-up enclosure for Cattery Cats to roam during special cat events. It is most commonly used for petting sessions or bonding time with the cats. This new enclosure has allowed more space for our furry friends to run and play making it less stressful for them in a new environment and encourages more happy times with humans.

STRAY FREE SELANGOR

THE HUMANE & COMPASSIONATE WAY

he stray animals of Selangor are blessed with the support and participation of our beloved DYMM Tengku

Permaisuri Selangor Tengku

Permaisuri Norashikin, who has kindly consented to be the Royal Patron for Stray Free Selangor (SFS) – The Humane And Compassionate Way. Selangor will be the first state in Malaysia to work towards an effective yet compassionate stray control programme.

VISION

SFS has a vision of a home/habitat for every soul, focusing on **Humane Education**, **High Volume Spay**/

Neuter, and Government Lobbying for humane, effective and sustainable ways to curb stray populations.

The current preferred stray control method of **Catch-And-Kill** practiced by all Municipal Councils in Malaysia in an effort to reduce strays has proven to be **highly ineffective**, **inhumane**, **unethical and expensive**. In its place, the action plan of SFS comprises:

Humane Education

Responsible Pet Ownership (RPO) programmes are being offered in schools, universities and residential communities.

High Volume Spay/Neuter

SPCA seeks to collaborate with Municipal

Councils, the Department of Veterinary Services, private vets, rescuers and NGOs to achieve high/spay neuter rates in communities and promote better animal welfare standards.

Government Lobbying

SE

SPCA lobbies the government for the welfare of community animals, habitats for spayed/neutered non-aggressive stray dogs and spayed/neutered cat colonies, mandatory spay/neuter and mandatory RPO seminars for dog owners.

NEUTERING SUBSIDY

An SFS fund has been created to













provide subsidised spay/neuter for rescuers and the low-income group to assist in spaying and neutering their pet animals. All applications for the neutering subsidy must be done via SPCA Selangor, and the voucher issued will be accepted at panel vets for a 50% discount for dog neutering and an 80% discount for cat neutering.

COMPASSIONATE COMMUNITIES

We are also working to create Caring and Compassionate Communities (CCC) where spayed/neutered strays/community animals can live their life free from misery and

capture. The CCC will be guided by SPCA guidelines in communities that are interested to embrace the Caring and Compassionate concept. Feeders will be educated on caring for community animals responsibly. We are delighted that DYMM Tengku Permaisuri Selangor Tengku Permaisuri Norashikin has founded Casa De Cat, a shelter for rescued stray felines in Shah Alam -- a wonderful initiative to encourage compassionate communities!

EDUCATION

Our Education program promotes animal welfare education, awareness and activities to enable participants to be better acquainted with animal welfare issues.

PCA's Education programme animal welfare promotes education -- creating awareness and organising activities to enable participants to be acquainted with local and international animal welfare issues. We believe that how a person perceives and treats animals reflect who they turn out to be within their wider community, as well as forge a better future for the treatment of animals.

VISITS TO SPCA

We welcome individuals and groups all year round to our SPCA Selangor

E.R.A. Centre. A visit enables students and volunteers to experience caring for the centre animals, sowing the seeds of compassion and volunteerism in them. Many schools, universities and corporations also visit SPCA Selangor as part of their community service programs. Anyone who is interested in volunteering at our centre are required to attend our Pet Care Programme (PCP) to equip themselves with the basic skills and knowledge needed to care for our animals and help out at the shelter. The SPCA staff also assist students on their assignments and projects related to the organisation or animal welfare in general.

Shah Alam Buddhist Dharma Class We have had the pleasure of being visited by the Shah Alam Buddhist Dharma Class on a yearly basis. This year, approximately 60 students graced our centre to learn about basic pet care with some help from our animals. The 5-16 year olds got plenty of interaction time with both dogs and cats, gaining an understanding of the animals and their behaviors.

ACMC

When approximately children from Ampang Methodist Church Kindergarten attended our in-house workshop, the children received firsthand experience on proper handling and

behavior around animals, as well as the enrichment activities we can provide for them as responsible carers.

REACHING OUT

SPCA Selangor is frequently invited to conduct educational workshops in kindergartens, schools, colleges and offices every year. Our officers conduct these workshops which encompass animal welfare related topics such as Responsible Pet Care and Ownership.

Educational Workshop @ R.E.A.L. Schools Cheras Campus

In order to create a kind and compassionate future for the treatment of animals, we believe a key factor to achieving this goal is through educating the upcoming generation. With an increasing interest in pet ownership as well as stray animals, promoting a caring and responsible attitude towards animals is one of the most effective paths for meaningful change. We happily accepted an invitation to give a talk to approximately 80 secondary students at R.E.A.L. Schools Cheras Campus (some of the students have also previously attended

our in-house workshop which allowed for animal interaction at our centre). The workshop was an interactive educational presentation with the help of our lovely demonstration dog, Marilyn. Students were taught basic care and handling skills which they could practise on Marilyn!

FARM ANIMAL WELFARE

In October 2019, SPCA Selangor organised and hosted a workshop on Certified Humane's laying hen welfare standards for farmers and animal feed producers and received positive responses from the workshop participants. We look forward to conducting more such workshops in the coming year and to working with more producers to create better living conditions for farm animals in Malaysia and the region.

Poor farm animal welfare standards not only cause untold suffering to millions of animals, but also put food safety and human health at risk. Until plant-based or lab-grown alternatives to animal products are more affordable and available, we have a moral duty to ensure that farm animals

Animal Inspector responds to reports from concerned members of the public of mistreated or neglected animals in and around the Klang Valley. From January to December 2019, we had received and checked on more than 590 reports - the increasing number and the nature of the complaints received reflect increasing public awareness and concern for animal welfare. This year, we have forwarded the majority of cases to the **Department of Veterinary** Services (DVS) for their attention and action,. We have refocused our resource on emergency rescues of strays (and occasionally pets) and rehabilitation of these rescued animals.

MOVING FORWARD

Going into 2020, we have very specific plans to improve our Inspectorate department through closer cooperation with individual rescuers, NGOs and the authorities. We are also hoping to collaborate with volunteers (intake: rescuing and outflow: rehoming/ relocating) to improve the efficiency of the department.

LOBBYING





The Animal Welfare Act 2015 is a comprehensive game changer in Malaysia and will oversee sweeping changes in how animals are treated in Malaysia.

Our Chairman, Christine Chin, is on the **National Animal Welfare Board** that meets quarterly to discuss AWA matters and work towards solving current and long standing animal welfare issues that plague our country. She has been an active advocate for better animal welfare in Malaysia for decades and is very happy that her participation in the National Animal Welfare Board gives SPCA a bigger and better voice for the animals.

SPCA Selangor set up a Farm Animal Welfare unit in June 2019 with the

objective of engaging with governmental authorities, farmers, producers, corporate buyers, and the public to improve the welfare of farm animals in Malaysia.

From June 2019 – November 2019, SPCA Selangor's Farm Animal Welfare unit played a role in the following victories for farm animal welfare in Malaysia:

21 August 2019: Subway Restaurants issued a written commitment to source only cage-free eggs for its Malaysia operations by the end of 2025.

29 Aug 2019:Tesco HQ made a public written commitment to transition fully to selling only cage-free eggs in Malaysia and Thailand by 2028.

SPCA Selangor's farm animal welfare

work is made possible thanks to the Open Philanthropy Project, and we are a member organisation of the Open Wing Alliance.

The SPCA Chairman met YB Ng Sze Han after the MPSJ dog catching debacle that infuriated dog lovers. A viral video showed MPSJ dog catchers getting offensive with a dog sympathiser Mr Koh who tried to prevent them from catching community dog Bruno in an inhumane way. SPCA offered to consult with municipal councils in stray pound design and humane management of strays. SPCA respresentatives also attended the court proceedings for this case, in which he is defended by lawyers Rajesh Nagarajan and Sachpreetraj Singh.

Thank you to all the kind individuals, schools, companies and organisations who have helped us raise much-needed funds so we can continue to carry out our operations, services and activities!

FOSTERING

Fostering gives animals that need extra care a higher chance to survive, and in general all animals a higher chance to find a forever home.
