

2022 has been a volatile year with the reopening of Malaysia and the world from the lockdown caused by the Covid pandemic, the Russian/Ukraine war, runaway inflation and Malaysia's own GE 15.

As we emerge from the lockdown, the realisation that we need to prioritise our values and evaluate our lifestyle comes into focus. Compassion resides in most of us but few put compassion into action. Indeed there are many ways to do so and the following are some of the ways.

Feeding, rescuing, neutering and rehoming strays and abandoned

live. When we sow the seeds of kindness and compassion towards animals we are also sowing the seeds of kindness and compassion to human beings.

Flood Relief

On 18 December 2021, SPCA volunteered in the flood relief movement at Taman Sri Muda, in collaboration with MAVMA, MSAVA, UPM, DVS and many other companies. We provided rescue, feeding services and medical services to cats and dogs that were affected by the flood, including those left behind by their owners during the emergency evacuation. Those that needed extra care were brought to UPM vets for treatment and shelter.



Stray Free Selangor (SFS)

SPCA Selangor receives many requests to either remove or relocate animals. However, relocation or rehoming is not a sustainable way as it is dangerous for the reallocated animals as they fail to adapt to the new environment, resulting in sickness and death.

Before this situation got worse, the royal patronage of Tengku Permaisuri of Selangor, Tengku Permaisuri Norashikin, introduced Stray Free Selangor (SFS) in 2017. With the vision of "A Home for Every Soul", SFS aims to control the overpopulation of strays in a humane manner, while spreading the awareness of living together with

strays in a peaceful manner.

Thanks to the funds and support from companies, corporations, and clinics, we were able to disburse hundreds of thousands of Ringgit Malaysia to support rescuers, feeders, and owners who helped stray animals on the street, subsidising the cost of neutering.

In March 2022, we rearranged our SFS programme and mobilised our clinic and staff based on a request from a group of rescuers with a large amount of strays at hand. We guided the rescuers to locate the animals in one area, which would be easier for our

team to organise temporary operations in two locations.

Ultimately, the SFS Rawang project was a huge success in which we were able to neuter 102 dogs in total. Each neutered dog was tagged as a remark before returning them to the rescuers.

Fortunately, with the help of the volunteers, SFS and SPCA Selangor were able to subsidise over half of the cost of the entire operation.



Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR)

In 2022, we had a lot of fun interacting with companies from different industries, such as Baker Hughes, Magnum, Ipsos Malaysia, Allianz Bank (Allianz4Good), and Shell. These parties engaged in corporate social responsibility (CSR) programs, including pet food donations and Pet Care Programme (PCP).



Pet Care Programme (PCP)

We welcome animal lovers who are willing to spend their time volunteering here at SPCA Selangor. Our Pet Care Programme (PCP) is a training workshop where everyone will have to go through before volunteering at SPCA Selangor. The workshop includes basic grooming, cleaning, dog walking, theories on animal welfare issues (Section 14 & 29 Animal Welfare Act), practical on pet care, and etc. There are also several safety and operational procedures that volunteers need to know about to understand how our shelter works. Once someone has completed the programme, they are able to volunteer whenever they wish.



Dog Training

On 29 October 2022, SPCA Selangor invited Rubini Maruthian from ABCDT and Dog Gone Good, a certified professional dog trainer, in honour of World Animal Day. Rubini shared some basic dog training tips such as sit and stay to cultivate well-mannered dogs.



World Animal Day (WAD)

On 29 October 2022, SPCA Selangor celebrated the World Animal Day (WAD) with the theme “Be Kind To All Kinds”, which aligns with our advocacy work towards animal welfare and protection. The mission of this event was to increase awareness in reducing the cruelty on animals and practising a Sharing World with creatures of all kinds. The celebration was graced by SPCA Selangor’s Royal Patron, DYMM Tengku Permaisuri Selangor, Tengku Permaisuri Norashikin, as well as VIP guests.

There were many pet-friendly and family-friendly activities, including pet medical check-ups, pet diet and nutrition

talks, dog training tips, and an animal IQ treasure hunt, all free of charge. 100 goodies bags were up for grabs for guests, while stock lasts. To reduce carbon footprint and to support sympathy towards animals, we served plant-based meals and refreshments during the event.



Farm Animal Welfare (FAW)

March 2022

The Malaysian Ministry of Agriculture ensured their awareness of the importance of possessing and upholding national cage-free rules, and promised that SPCA will be included as stakeholders for future discussions with egg producers, veterinarians, and government agencies.

September 2022

SPCA signed a cage-free pledge with My Boat Noodle, a restaurant chain of which Toridoll Corporation is a minority shareholder. We successfully discussed with My Boat Noodle's General Manager and halted our participation in the OWA global pressure campaign on Toridoll to help them with supplier and logistics issues.

Representatives from SPCA, Jacinta and Ee Lynn, attended the Southeast Asia Farm Animal Welfare (SEAFaw) Fellowship retreat and learned about different organisations and opportunities to attract funds and collaborations, as well as ways to improve the

operation of our organisations and units to aim for higher achievements.

November 2022

SPCA Selangor hosted the OWA Asia Summit 2022 with a visit and dinner at Christine's Melawati Dog Sanctuary and a field trip to SPCA Selangor's premises. Delegates were impressed by the Sanctuary, our shelter and its operations. During the conference, all OWA Coalition partners from Asia exchanged progresses, strategies and plans for future campaigns among many things that were discussed.

Other accomplishments

We continued to reach out to different companies, especially multinationals with franchises in Malaysia and Southeast Asia, and to poultry farmers and our new Minister of Agriculture.

Jacinta and Ee Lynn were part of a team in Asia to develop a database of farmed animal welfare benchmarks for OWA member countries (and possibly some larger non-member countries such as China) for

publication both in local presses and online to pressure governments into improving their farmed animal welfare standards and bringing their standards in line with other countries in the region.

For the Plant-Based Advocacy Unit, Davina surpassed her Grant targets / KPI of reaching out to companies and institutions. Some companies such as Bank Islam Malaysia expressed their interest in promoting a plant-based diet and executed relevant programmes.



Plant-Based Campaign Unit (PBCU)

The Plant-Based Campaign Unit encouraged Malaysians to practise compassion to animals through the way they eat. This was done by presentations that were held and cooking demos. Overall, the most responsive sector was corporate, who benefited in organising Plant-Based programmes as part of employee wellbeing or recreational activities and also contributing to their CSR programmes.

UNIVERSITI TEKNOLOGI PETRONAS

SPCA Selangor's first university collaboration was with Universiti Teknologi Petronas (UTP). UTP's very first Plant-Based Campaign was held from the 2nd to 5th June 2022 by the UTP Go Green Movement and also in celebration of World Environment Day. It involved a plant-based food sale and was held with the assistance of the UTP Residential College Support Unit, UTP Residential Village and UTP's Student Representative Council. Plant-based meat alternative sponsor, Phuture Foods, sponsored their star product, High Fibre Chick'n, for the campaign's food sale arranged by PBCU.

BANK ISLAM

SPCA Selangor's Farm Animal Welfare Programme and Plant-Based Campaign Units held a joint 'Plant-Based for the Planet' presentation for the staff of Bank Islam at their headquarters as part of their 'Sustainability and Me' Week on 25th November 2022. PBCU's cooking demo featured a dairy-free Cashew Alfredo with Asian Mushrooms. Participants were later treated to a delicious plant-based rendang lunch by a small local plant-based food business, Mushroom Lah, also arranged by PBCU.

CIMB BANK

CIMB Bank collaborated with SPCA Selangor via their Sustainability department to present 2 sessions, 'Sustainability and Diet: Connecting the Dots' and 'Vegan Zero Waste Living', each consisting of a presentation and walkthrough food workshops lasting 90 minutes in total.

SHELL MALAYSIA

Shell Malaysia engaged with SPCA Selangor to present a plant-based talk as part of their 'Happiness Week' virtual employee engagement programme, on 3rd of December 2021. The presentation focused on Davina's personal journey on how veganism improved her physical and mental health as well as the positive impact of a plant-based diet on the planet, animals and personal well being. The presentation ended in an easy 'bring-to-work' lunch recipe for 'Happy Rainbow Ramen'.

Sustainable Protein

We are proudly moving towards a more sustainable and environmentally-friendly method of feeding our dogs here at SPCA Selangor. ProBalance's Black Soldier Fly Larvae (BSFL) dog kibbles have since been a healthier and more sustainable alternative food source for our dogs. As the BSFL are locally sourced, this reduces our carbon footprint which helps the environment. Their large numbers and ability to convert organic waste into protein in a short amount of time is effective in the production of protein in a sustainable and scalable way. Not only do the BSFL dog kibbles help the environment, we have observed that our dogs love eating the BSFL dog kibbles and we have seen positive effects on our dogs since changing their food source from chicken or lamb based protein:

- Better skin conditions
- No allergic reactions or issues with existing allergies
- No issues with feeding pattern

We are pleased with the results and will be continuing to aim for more sustainable ways of providing the best for our animals and our planet.



Government Lobbying

On 16 November 2022, SPCA Selangor's Chairman, Christine Chin, proposed Guidelines for Pets in condominiums and flats to YB Rodziah and Wawa from Pakatan Harapan, with the aim of making Selangor a pet-friendly state. SPCA Selangor has set a total of 13 rules and regulations in accordance with By-Law 14 in the Third Schedule of the Strata Management (Maintenance & Management) Regulations 2015 for residents who were to keep their pets in a shared environment to upkeep a harmonious living space by considering the welfare of other residents while also taking good care of their own pets.
