













Patron's Message

It gives me a great pleasure and a sense of fulfilment as I pen my message for the SPCA Selangor's 2023 Annual Review. On looking back, I felt deeply honoured and privileged to have been invited to be SPCA Selangor's patron in 2012 by Ms Christine Chin, Chairman of SPCA Selangor.

In reflection, during my tenure as Patron, we had worked together in raising the bar for animal welfare and in lobbying for the current Animal Welfare Act 2015 as well as the many awareness and fundraising activities.

I must commend Ms Christine Chin for her vision and passion in leading the "pack" with much success in moving out of the box of shelter management from just animal rescue to education and mooting spay/neutering as the compassionate way of managing strays.

Allow me to record my heartfelt thanks to Duli Yang Maha Mulia Tengku Permaisuri Selangor, Tengku Permaisuri Hajah Norashikin for her Royal Patronage, and support for the SPCA Stray Free Selangor, which was set up in March 2017 and has since then funded over RM2million for the neutering of strays and rescued animals in Selangor.

Continuing this vision in 2022 and 2023, the SPCA team started the "Potong Royong" projects where neutering programs were conducted in communities. These projects which includes the Sri Nanding (March 2023: 555 cats; MPKlang (August 2023: 362 cats and 125 dogs and Puchong Mini Potong Royong: 300 dogs) would not have been successful if it weren't for the support of DYMM Tengku Permaisuri Selangor, like-minded organisations, team members, and volunteers.

The 2023 World Animal Day theme of "Creating Caring and Compassionate Communities (CCCC) which is a dedicated initiative that foster empathy, kindness, and compassion as well as bridge communications and actionable gaps so that the councils, residents, animal rescuers and relevant stakeholders will be able to work harmoniously to reduce stray animals and encourage adoption.

One of the many efforts made in 2023 include submission of proposals to Municipal Councils with regards to the management of stray animals and implementation of animal freedom; freedom from hunger/thirst, discomfort, pain/injury/disease, fear/distress as well as freedom to express normal behaviour.

CCCC also takes a strong stand in encouraging Municipal Pounds to provide education, spay/neuter and rehoming program as opposed to catch and kill approach.

SPCA Selangor continues to educate the public through its Pet Care Program, and I am proud to note that it is mandatory for all volunteers at SPCA Selangor to ensure safety measures for both volunteers and the animals.

It is by this measure that we need to look back at the extremely difficult months and there is no question that the SPCA Selangor's family, consisting of staff, volunteers, management, donors, sponsors, and the public have excelled and remained resilient and focused in rising to the challenge of coping with many abandoned pets and animals' midst the difficulties.

This year, I'm delighted to contribute RM 40,000 to SPCA Selangor from my autobiography's proceeds. It brings me immense joy to support the remarkable efforts of the SPCA team in animal welfare.

The dedication and passion of the entire SPCA Selangor family, including staff, volunteers, management, donors, sponsors, and the public, have truly excelled in facing challenges.

Potong Royong

A Year of Impact: Potong Royong 2023 Leaves Pawsitive Mark on Communities

In the spirit of compassion and community, 2023 marked an extraordinary chapter for our Potong Royong initiative. With a commitment to curbing the issue of stray animals, we embarked on a journey that resonated far beyond expectations.



The inaugural Potong Royong in Sri Nanding set the stage for an incredible year. In March, we successfully neutered a staggering 555 cats, not only controlling the stray cat population but also addressing the potential health and environmental issues associated with uncontrolled breeding. The positive impact of our efforts rippled through the community, fostering a safer and healthier environment for all residents.

Bandar Botanik, August 2023: Unleashing Compassion

Building on the momentum, our second venture in Bandar Botanik in August proved transformative. Here, we not only neutered 362 cats but extended our efforts to include 125 dogs, mitigating the challenges associated with uncontrolled canine populations. The holistic approach of our project not only promotes responsible pet ownership but also contributes to a more harmonious coexistence between animals and the community.

Mini Potong Royong in Rawang and Puchong: Nurturing Communities

Beyond these major events, our Mini Potong Royong sessions in Rawang and Puchong demonstrated the power of community engagement. Approximately 300 dogs received care, leading to a visible reduction in the number of strays and fostering a sense of responsibility among pet owners. The impact reached beyond the animals themselves, positively influencing the overall well-being of the communities we served.

The E.R.A Center utilizes a blend of commercial dry pellets, canned soft meals, and cooked meat and rice to nourish our dogs and cats. Ongoing donations of pet food benefit both the Center's immediate needs and our Food Bank, which supplies pet food rations to community feeders and rescuers. There was a significant decrease in the number of surrendered canines in 2023, and our focus shifted to rehabilitating and responding to emergencies.

We are happy to have found loving and caring homes for almost 93 of the more than 106 dogs and puppies that the SPCA Selangor took in this year. We are also making every effort to find homes for the remaining animals.

This year, emergency response and rehabilitation were our main priorities. Many mistreated, wounded, and abandoned animals were brought in.

With the help of our committed kennel staff, led by kennel manager Erica Remington, these ill, afraid, and anxious animals have become healthy and happy pets. Although adoption hasn't always been easy, we adopt a NO-KILL policy, meaning that all healthy animals will stay with us until they find loving homes. To facilitate a seamless transition into their new homes, post-adoption communication is recommended.

The Kennel Team puts a lot of effort into maintaining cleanliness in every kennel and making sure all our furry friends are fed and cared for.

In 2023, SPCA Selangor has been dedicated to caring for over 224 cats and kittens. 153 of these feline friends have been able to find warm and loving forever homes, where they can receive the attention and care they deserve. It is heartwarming to see so many cats and kittens finding their way to happy and healthy homes.

We have been fortunate to have the support of kind and responsible fosterers, who have taken in and cared for 16 kittens/cats, and nearly all of them have since found their forever homes. We face challenges with the number of kittens that are surrendered or abandoned, therefore we are immensely grateful to our fosterers who generously open up their hearts and homes to help us ease our burdens and save more lives.

We have frequently mentioned our cats in quarantine this year to create awareness and educate the public about the dangers of dumping animals. We also aim to raise awareness about the importance of gently surrendering cats and kittens, as well as the needs of newborn kittens and fostering. Through these short posts, we hope to help people connect with these cats and kittens on a personal level.



World Animal Day

On October 28, 2023, SPCA Selangor marked World Animal Day (WAD) with the theme "Creating Caring and Compassionate Communities (CCCC)." This initiative, a dedicated effort by SPCA, aims to cultivate empathy, kindness, and compassion, fostering effective communication and collaboration among the council, residents, animal rescuers, and stakeholders. The goal is to work harmoniously to reduce stray animals and promote adoption. The event also honoured Potong Royong, featuring an appreciation ceremony for all Potong Royong vet volunteers and sponsors. The success of this project was made possible through the support of DYMM Tengku Permaisuri Selangor, like-minded organizations, team members, and volunteers. The celebration was graced by SPCA Selangor's Royal Patron, DYMM Tengku Permaisuri Selangor, Tengku Permaisuri Norashikin, along with VIP guests.

The event commenced with a demonstration by Unit Pengesan (K9) Jabatan Bomba dan Penyelamat Malaysia, showcasing Fire Investigation and Cadaver Dogs. There were numerous booths and activities, including MPAJ Licensing registration, a Potong Royong exhibition, Petotum Pet Insurance registration booth, games and lucky draws, busker performances, and various pet food brands. A total of 300 goodie bags were distributed to guests while supplies lasted. In an effort to reduce carbon footprint and promote empathy towards animals, plant-based meals and refreshments were served throughout the event.





Pet Care Program (PCP)

As per our Standard Operating Procedure, we introduce all first-time volunteers to our Pet Care Program (PCP), a one-time training workshop that has been running for a few years at SPCA Selangor. This mandatory session covers SPCA Protocols, animal health, and the Animal Welfare Act in Malaysia. Various hands-on activities are available, along with essential safety and operational procedures. These are crucial for volunteers to comprehend our shelter's functioning and become advocates for SPCA Selangor.

The PCP is conducted every weekend, providing an opportunity for new volunteers to join. This program not only imparts theoretical knowledge but also equips volunteers with practical insights, serving as a foundational step for anyone aspiring to become an official SPCA volunteer.

We are delighted to witness a growing number of new volunteers each week who express enthusiasm in contributing and learning about animal welfare.

In addition, our facility is also accessible for private events, like Birthday "Pawties", where kids can celebrate their big day with loved ones, friends, exquisite food, and the delight of hanging out with our energetic pups. Outreach Events

Campaigns and Activities

Shell Business Operations Kuala Lumpur (SBO KL)

We are grateful to have received invitations to several of Shell's events. These events have provided us the opportunity to raise money as well as raise awareness of animal welfare. Through merchandise sales at their events, such as Shell Parents Day and Shell Family Day, we were able to fundraise a significant amount of money.



Every year, Baker Hughes hosts an annual Universal Children's Day Bazaar at their headquarters, to which the SPCA was once again invited. Other than that, we managed to raise money by selling merchandise which includes t-shirts, calendars, and diaries during their event.











Sequoia International School

In addition to raising money for SPCA Selangor, Sequoia International School held a walkathon carnival called the "Pawsitive Step Campaign" to educate parents, teachers, and students about the significance of animal care. A portion of the earnings from each walkathon ticket sold will go to the SPCA. Prior to the walkathon, the SPCA was invited to give a speech at the school to inform the kids about the organization and animal welfare. The subject matter captivated the interest of all the students and inspired them to contribute to SPCA fundraising.

Spay-neuter Program

We have been operating our high-volume, low-cost spay-neuter program at the E.R.A. Centre. We offer subsidized spay-neuter procedures to those who own companion animals that belong to lower-class individuals, as well as to animal rescuers and those who look after strays in their communities. This year, a total of 5,103 male and female cats and dogs have been neutered.

As opposed to other temporary fixes like dog catching and euthanasia, which are inefficient, costly, and short-sighted, neutering is a proactive intervention that addresses the overpopulation problem at its root. Neutering immediately tackles the overpopulation issue, since thousands of unwanted litters and stray animals are either put to death or suffer on the streets. By spaying and neutering one male and one female cat, more than 20,000 unwanted births can be prevented in 7 years!

We continue to support small Shelter owners and rescues by providing an affordable rescue adoption package (neutering, vaccination, parasite control, minor treatment, education) or neutering. Our neutering program is outsourced to Star Pets and PawsDoc.

We have neutered over 55,000 cats and dogs in the Klang Valley and beyond since 2003. We are delighted to share that the Department of Veterinary Services (DVS) aligns with the vision of having a Stray Free Malaysia, which we can do by passing additional legislation, actively neutering pets, and strays, granting different licenses to different entities, and educating the public.

CCCC is a dedicated initiative that foster empathy, kindness, and compassion as well communications and actionable gaps so that the council, residents, animal rescuers and relevant stakeholders will be able to work harmoniously to reduce stray animals and encourage adoption. One of the many efforts include proposals for Municipal Councils with regards to the management of stray animals and implementation of animal freedom; freedom hunger/thirst, discomfort. pain/injury/disease, fear/distress as well as freedom to express normal behavior. CCCC also takes a strong stand in encouraging Municipal Pounds to provide education, spay/neuter and rehoming program as opposed to catch and kill approach.



CCCC strives to prioritize on the following pillars of implementation:

- 1. Take the lead to establish training workshops to train personnel to be responsible with proper dog catching techniques and prevent unnecessary suffering.
- 2. Work with animal rescuers within Municipalities to assist in spay/neuter and rehoming as well as being a vigilante within their residential community.
- 3. Continued efforts for Stray Free Selangor program with Royal Patron, DYMM Tengku Permaisuri Selangor.
- 4. Promote Responsible Pet Ownership (RPO) amongst pet owners and provide proper shelter management for Municipal Council's workers.
- 5. Create community shelters within Tamans.
- 6. Work with relevant communities to allow Tap Neuter Return (TNR) stray animals with acceptable SOP whereby rescuers can continue to feed, treat, and manage them.
- Encourage commercial enterprises to be responsible and spay/neuter stray animals that they keep within or surrounding their commercial compound.
