It is a privilege for me to pen this message in the SPCA Selangor 2024 Annual Review. It has been an incredible honor for me to serve as Patron since 2012, a role entrusted to me by Ms. Christine Chin, Chairman of SPCA Selangor as well as the SPCA Board of Members.

Over the years, there has been meaningful progress in advancing animal welfare, from lobbying the Animal Welfare Act 2015 to raising awareness and mobilizing resources for impactful initiatives. This journey has been both fulfilling and inspiring, as each effort brings us closer to a kinder and more compassionate future for animals.

Under the leadership of Chairman Christine Chin, SPCA Selangor has continuously pushed boundaries to advocate for humane and sustainable solutions. Her dedication has driven significant advancements, from enhancing public education to advocating the importance of spay and neuter initiatives as the most compassionate way to manage stray populations.

One of the most impactful programs in this journey has been Potong Royong, which has flourished throughout 2024, leading to the successful neutering of over 2,000 cats and dogs in Selangor and Wilayah. This initiative would not have been possible without the support of volunteers, veterinarians, and generous sponsors who share the vision of reducing stray populations through ethical and effective means. Special appreciation is extended to Duli Yang Maha Mulia Tengku Permaisuri Selangor, Tengku Permaisuri Hajah Norashikin, whose steadfast Royal Patronage continues to strengthen the Stray Free Selangor (SFS) campaign. Since its inception in March 2017 SFS has played a vital role in funding spay-neuter efforts, making a lasting difference for both animals and communities in Selangor.

World Animal Day 2024 was a testament to the power of collective action, with the theme "Snip & Share, Together We Care" where the focus is on Creating Caring and Compassionate Communities (CCCC), serving as a guiding principle for humane coexistence. This initiative fosters empathy, understanding, and cooperation between local councils, residents, animal rescuers, and key stakeholders, paving the way for more effective stray management and adoption efforts. Among the key efforts this year was submitting proposals to municipal councils, advocating for policies that uphold animal welfare principles. These proposals emphasize the fundamental freedoms every animal deserves—protection from hunger, animal deserves—protection from hunger, discomfort, pain, distress, and the right to express natural behaviour.

Additionally, CCCC continues to push for municipal pounds to adopt education-driven approaches, prioritising spay/neuter and rehoming programs over outdated capture-and-cull methods.

Education remains a cornerstone of responsible pet ownership and animal welfare advocacy. Through structured learning initiatives like the Pet Care Program, volunteers gain essential knowledge that not only enhances their experience but also ensures the well-being of the animals they care for. The resilience and dedication shown by staff, volunteers, donors, sponsors, and the public in the face of challenges stand as a testament to a shared commitment to making a lasting impact.

In reflecting on a year marked by both significant progress and heartrending challenges, heartfelt empathy is extended to all animals affected by cruelty across Malaysia in 2024. As efforts in lobbying for the Animal Welfare Act, spearheading initiatives like Potong Royong, and nurturing compassionate communities continue, I continue to share the hope that remains steadfast for a brighter, kinder 2025—a future where every animal is treated with the care and respect they deserve.

# Chairman's Message

## Justice for Kopi Movement Humane Stray Management

In October 2024, a young and playful dog was killed in the name of stray control in Terengganu by the Besut municipal council. When the video of the killing of Kopi went viral, and created a massive outcry from Malaysians about how municipal councils handle stray problems. SPCA's Creating Caring & Compassionate Communities (CCCC) espouses humane stray control via spay-neuter by caring communities and selected release of neutered animals into communities that accept them. The bulk of the spayed and neutered animals would likely not be well received in the communities and should be relocated to shelters. TNRM, short for Trap-Neuter-Release-Manage, is an ideology that while humane is not practical in its implementation, the M stands for managing the strays that would have been release but the strays would still be left to fend for themselves as they would likely be injured through fights and human abuse and natural disasters such as flooding. Therefore, releasing them is not a practical solution.

SPCA has embarked on Potong Royong, a massive weeklong spay-neuter campaign with municipal councils to advocate for humane stray management. Potong Royong requires funding from stakeholders and the public to be effective, and we are working on sponsorships with interested corporations and stakeholders. SPCA hopes to work with all municipal councils in Selangor over the next few years. To date, we have worked with 11 municipal councils, including MPAJ, MBSJ, MBSA, etc. In total, we have spayed and neutered 4,387 animals by the end of 2024.

As we live in more dense communities and condominiums, urban policies on pets in high-rise condominiums/apartments would be required. In Malaysia, pets are allowed in condominiums/high-rise as per the strata act, however, many condominiums under the Joint Management Body (JMB) in Malaysia have unconstitutionally restricted pets in their condominiums. Unless pets have been a nuisance, they are definitely allowed in condominiums. If you are a pet owner or a JMB Board member facing this issue, please approach SPCA, where we would be happy to present the guidelines to you. (Refer to page 9 for the guidelines)

I would like to express my sincere appreciation to all our donors, corporate sponsors, CSR partners, and the municipal councils who have supported our mission for humane stray management, especially Tengku Permaisuri Selangor, Tengku Permaisuri Hajah Norashikin, Tan Sri Lee Lam Thye, our dedicated Board Members, and the hardworking SPCA staff. I would also like to thank the responsible rescuers and loyal supporters who continue to stand by us and the animals in need. # Potong Royong™

## A Game-Changer in Stray Population Management

Since its launch in March 2023, Potong Royong has become one of Malaysia's most impactful mass neutering initiatives, championing a humane and sustainable approach to stray population management. What began as an ambitious effort to curb the rise of stray animals in Selangor has evolved into a community-driven movement, rallying veterinarians, volunteers, and corporate sponsors to work towards a Stray-Free Selangor.

Over the past two years, Potong Royong has made remarkable strides in addressing Malaysia's stray issue through a structured Trap-Neuter-Return-Manage (TNRM) program. With 5 large-scale campaigns and multiple Mini Potong Royong™ events, we have neutered over 4,387 animals—a testament to the power of collective action.

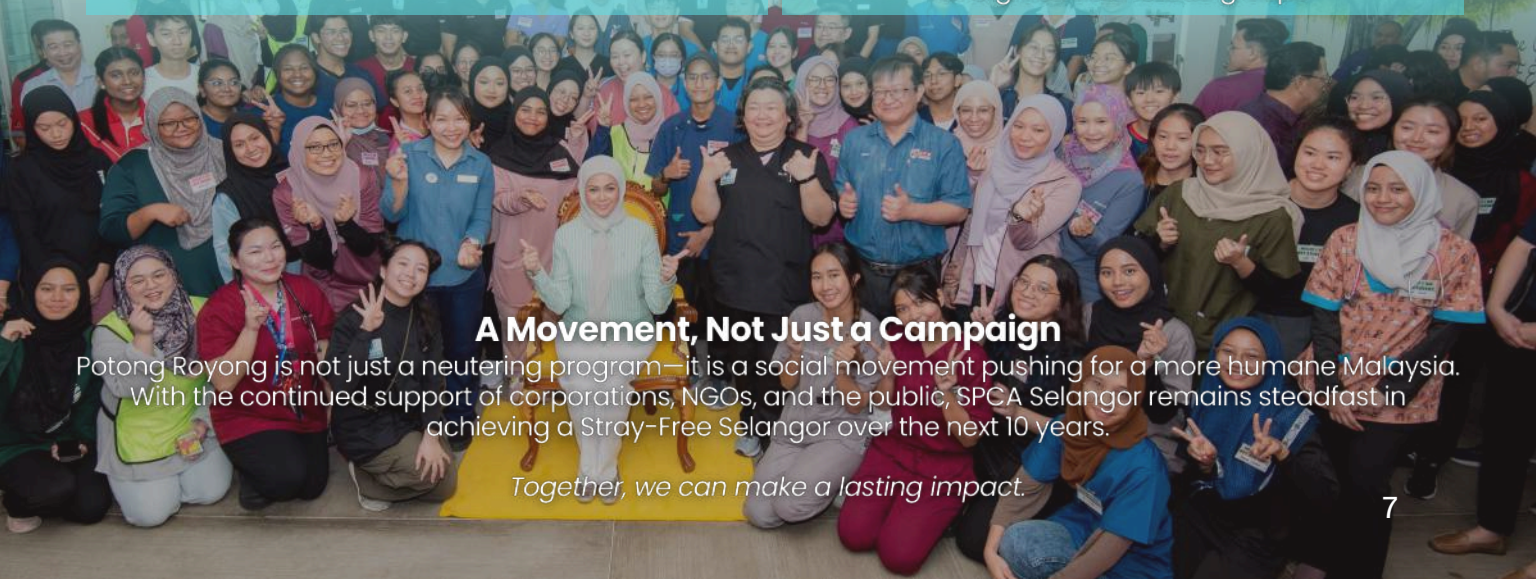

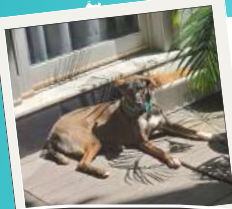

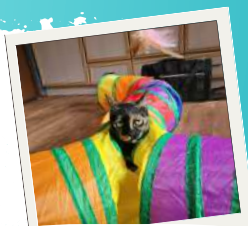
**Lilo**

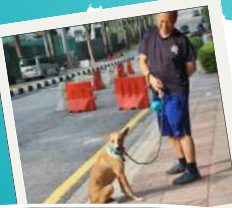


**Jackie**

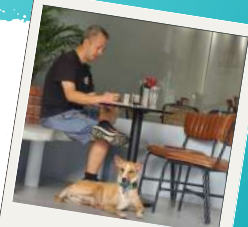

# Guidelines for Pets

## In Condominiums and Apartment Buildings

These guidelines are prepared in response to regulations for strata properties.

Under By-Law 14 in the Third Schedule of the Strata Management (Maintenance & Management) Regulations 2015, it states that:

***Residents are able to keep pets but any annoyance or nuisance to other residents or pets which may be dangerous to the safety or health of other residents will be prohibited.***

These guidelines are written to ensure harmonious living and consideration for your neighbours.

1. Pets shall not be kept, bred, or used for any commercial purpose.
2. Pets must be confined to the pet owner's unit and must not be allowed to roam free.
3. Pets must not be left unattended on patios or balconies.
4. Pets in transit are to be carried, restrained by a leash, or placed in an animal carrier.
5. Persons who walk pets are responsible for immediately cleaning up after their animals and discarding securely bagged pet droppings.
6. Pet owners/caregivers are responsible for any damage caused by their pets in the common areas.
7. No pet shall be allowed to become a nuisance or create any unreasonable disturbance. Examples of nuisance behavior for the purposes of this paragraph are:
  - a. Pets whose unruly behavior causes personal injury or property damage.
  - b. Pets who make noise continuously and/or incessantly.
  - c. Pets who relieve themselves on walls or floors of common areas.
  - d. Pets who exhibit aggressive or other dangerous or potentially dangerous behavior.
  - e. Pets who are conspicuously unclean or parasite infested.
8. All pet owners/caregivers must ensure that the pets are well cared for, well fed, have a proper exercise routine and medical attention when required to ensure their optimum health.
9. Any resident or management personnel observing an infraction of any of these rules shall discuss or give notice to the owner to comply with the rules.
10. If the complaint is not resolved, it must be put in writing, signed, and presented to the management committee. If the board is in agreement with such complaint, the pet owner will receive written notice of the violation.
11. The management committee may require the permanent removal of any pet, if such pet is determined to be a nuisance or a danger to the housing community and its residents.
12. If so, the pet owner will have 3 days to remove the pet from the premises.
13. For avoidance of doubt, maids and minors who are tending to the pet will be considered as caregivers, with pet owners bearing ultimate responsibility for their pets.

# Justice for Kopi

## A Movement to End Animal Cruelty

In October 2024, the Justice for Kopi movement was born in Besut, Terengganu, following the heartbreaking death of Kopi — a friendly and well-loved stray dog who captured the hearts of many through viral videos of her playing affectionately with a kitten. Kopi was allegedly shot during a stray management operation by the Besut District Council, sparking nationwide outrage and a call for more humane and accountable treatment of strays in Malaysia.

In the days following the tragedy, hundreds of passionate individuals came together at The Candlelight Gathering: Justice for Kopi & All Stray Animals, organized by a coalition of animal rights organizations. Under the warm glow of flickering candles, attendees stood in solemn unity — each flame symbolizing hope, grief, and an unwavering commitment to end animal cruelty. It was a powerful reminder that change begins with collective compassion and a shared voice.

### **Animal cruelty is not just a crime**

*It is a moral failing that reflects deeply on us as a society. It is our responsibility to speak out for the voiceless, and to demand humane, lasting solutions to stray animal management.*

# E.R.A. Centre

Education, Rehabilitation & Adoption

**Year 2024** saw a significant drop in animal surrenders compared to the previous year, reflecting positive progress in responsible pet ownership. Meanwhile, 187 dogs, puppies, cats, and kittens found loving homes through adoption.

## Food and Funds

The E.R.A. Center continues to provide nutritious meals for our animals, combining dry food, canned meals, and freshly cooked food. Donations of pet food support both our Center's residents animals, community feeders and responsible rescuers. The Center sustains its operations through multiple funding sources, such as item sales, walk-in donations, and proceeds from our charity shop. ## Services

SPCA Selangor receives daily requests for assistance through calls, emails, and social media, with many seeking shelter for stray and abandoned animals. While limited resources prevent us from taking in every case, we strive to help whenever space allows. Our efforts focus on sustainable solutions such as spay and neuter programs and Trap-Neuter-Release-Manage (TNRM) practices to reduce stray populations humanely. Looking ahead to 2025, we remain committed to advancing animal welfare in Malaysia and staying attuned to the concerns of the community.

# Kennels

**In 2024, there was a distinct decline in the number of surrendered dogs, allowing greater focus on rehabilitation and emergency cases.**

## Kennel Management

We are delighted that 67 dogs found loving homes this year, surpassing the 64 brought into our care, and we continue striving to match every animal with the right family. This year, our primary efforts were directed towards emergency response and rehabilitation, as many animals arrived in dire conditions—abandoned, injured, or victims of mistreatment. Thanks to the dedication of our kennel team, led by Kennel Manager, these once fearful and unwell animals have been nursed back to health and happiness.

Adoption is not always a straightforward journey, but with our NO-KILL policy, every healthy animal remains in our care until they are matched with the right home. To ensure a smooth adjustment, we encourage post-adoption follow-ups. Meanwhile, our Kennel Team works tirelessly to maintain a clean, safe environment and provide each animal with proper care and nourishment.

## Cattery Management

In 2024, 127 cats were brought in and cared for at SPCA Selangor, receiving the necessary attention and support to prepare them for better futures. We are delighted that 120 of these cats and kittens have been adopted into loving homes, where they will receive the care and affection they deserve.

Managed by our dedicated Cattery Manager, we ensure that every cat receives proper care, enrichment, and socialization while they wait for their forever homes. Fostering continues to be an essential part of our efforts, and we are deeply grateful to a compassionate rescuer couple, Ben and Mary, who fostered 32 cats this year. Their generosity has provided these cats with a safe and nurturing environment, increasing their chances of finding permanent homes.

As part of our ongoing mission, we have continued to raise awareness about responsible pet surrender and the dangers of abandonment, particularly for vulnerable kittens. Through education and advocacy, we hope to inspire more people to make compassionate and responsible choices for the welfare of animals in need.

# World Animal Day 2024



World Animal Day 2024 was celebrated on October 26, 2024, at SPCA Selangor, bringing together animal lovers, advocates, and stakeholders to champion the cause of animal welfare. This year's theme, "Snip & Share, Together We Care," emphasized the crucial role of spaying and neutering in managing the stray animal population while fostering a community-driven approach to animal care. A major highlight was the recognition of the Stray Free Selangor (SFS) initiative and the remarkable success of Potong Royong, a large-scale spay-and-neuter program. With over 2,496 animals sterilized across various districts this year and 13,793 animals spayed and neutered under SFS as of 2023, these initiatives continue to make a lasting impact. The event featured the esteemed presence of DYMM Tengku Permaisuri Selangor, a K9 demonstration by Jabatan Bomba dan Penyelamat Malaysia, and an Appreciation Awards Ceremony honoring sponsors, contributors, rescuers, and fosterers. Additionally, through dedicated fundraising efforts, an impressive RM363,000 was raised to further support the Stray Free Selangor (SFS) program, strengthening ongoing spay-and-neuter initiatives.

This year's celebration also reinforced SPCA Selangor's Creating Caring and Compassionate Communities (CCCC) initiative, which advocates for empathy and collaboration among municipal councils, residents, rescuers, and stakeholders to address animal welfare issues humanely. Through CCCC, efforts are being made to encourage municipal councils to shift towards ethical stray animal management practices, prioritizing spay/neuter programs and rehoming efforts over outdated catch-and-kill methods. Attendees also enjoyed various engaging activities, including a Potong Royong exhibition, a mini petting zoo by Farm in the City, busker performances, and educational booths. World Animal Day 2024 was not only a celebration but also a powerful reminder of the collective responsibility in ensuring a more compassionate and sustainable future for animals in Malaysia.

# Humane Education

## Pet Care Program (PCP)

As part of our Standard Operating Procedure(SOP), all first-time volunteers are required to participate in the Pet Care Programme (PCP)—a one-time training workshop that has been an integral part of SPCA Selangor for several years. This essential session provides an overview of SPCA protocols, animal health, and the Animal Welfare Act in Malaysia, ensuring that volunteers understand the key principles of responsible animal care. The workshop includes a mix of theoretical learning and hands-on activities, covering essential safety measures and operational procedures necessary for working within the shelter. By completing the PCP, volunteers gain a deeper understanding of how the shelter operates and are better prepared to advocate for SPCA Selangor's mission.

Held every weekend, the PCP offers new volunteers the chance to get involved, equipping them with both knowledge and practical skills. This structured approach serves as an important first step for those looking to make a meaningful impact in animal welfare. It has been incredibly encouraging to see a steady increase in individuals eager to contribute their time and effort each week.

# Fundraising

## Bargain Basement @ SPCA Selangor

In April 2024, SPCA Selangor, in collaboration with IOI Foundation, opened a branch of Bargain Basement at its premises. With IOI Foundation's generous support in renovating the space, this initiative provides a platform for repurposing pre-loved items while raising essential funds for animal welfare. All proceeds from the store go directly to SPCA Selangor, ensuring continuous support for its operations and initiatives.

Through the sale of donated clothing, household goods, books, and accessories, Bargain Basement promotes sustainability while giving shoppers the opportunity to contribute to a meaningful cause. In just a few months, the store successfully raised RM13,000, helping SPCA Selangor provide care and resources for animals in need. By shopping or donating, supporters make a positive impact on both the environment and the well-being of animals.



# Spay & Neuter Program

SPCA Selangor continues to run a high-volume, low-cost spay-neuter program at the E.R.A. Centre, offering subsidized procedures for pet owners from low-income backgrounds, animal rescuers, and community caregivers. In 2024 alone, 4,340 cats and dogs have been neutered, helping to control the stray population and prevent countless unwanted litters. Our efforts also extend to supporting small shelters and independent rescuers by providing affordable rescue adoption packages, which include neutering, vaccinations, parasite control, and minor treatments. These procedures are carried out in partnership with Star Pets and PawsDoc.

Since 2003, over 60,000 cats and dogs have been spayed or neutered through our programs across the Klang Valley and beyond. Unlike costly and ineffective measures like dog catching and euthanasia, neutering is a long-term solution that tackles overpopulation at its core. Just one pair of unneutered cats can lead to over 20,000 births in seven years. We are encouraged by the Department of Veterinary Services (DVS) supporting the vision of a Stray Free Malaysia through stronger legislation, large-scale neutering, proper licensing, and public education.

## Stray Free Selangor (SFS)

SPCA Selangor often receives requests to remove or relocate stray animals, but relocation is not a sustainable solution as many animals struggle to adapt, leading to illness or death. To address this issue, our Royal Patron, Tengku Permaisuri Norashikin, launched Stray Free Selangor (SFS) in 2017 with the vision of "A Home for Every Soul." SFS focuses on humane population control through neutering while promoting peaceful coexistence with strays.

With generous support from corporations, clinics, and donors, we have disbursed substantial funds to assist rescuers, feeders, and pet owners in neutering stray animals. Thanks to dedicated volunteers, SFS and SPCA Selangor were able to subsidize over half of the costs, ensuring the program's continued impact. Since the campaign's launch in March 2017, a total of 14,976 animals have been neutered under the SFS initiative as of December 2024, significantly contributing to humane stray population control.



# Government Lobbying

## CREATING CARING AND COMPASSIONATE COMMUNITIES (CCCC) with MUNICIPAL COUNCILS & STAKEHOLDERS

*"When you sow the seeds of kindness and compassion towards animals, you are also sowing the seeds of kindness and compassion towards human beings"*

**Vision:** Creating Caring & Compassionate Communities within Municipalities where the Council, interested residents, animal rescuers and stakeholders (from DVS and government animal welfare agencies) to work harmoniously to reduce stray animals and promote adoption (much like a mini SPCA)

**Mission:** To change Municipal Pounds into an Education, Spay/Neuter, Rehoming Centre to promote RPO and Caring and Compassionate Communities where everyone cares and takes responsibilities of their pets and community animals and animal welfare wardens/catchers are well trained and proactive, and not resort to violent behaviour in carrying out their tasks.

### Implementation:

1. SPCA Selangor/any reputable Animal Welfare organisation to take the lead in establishing Training Program modules/workshops to train personnel in being responsible for proper dog catching techniques, proper animal husbandry to prevent unnecessary suffering.
2. Reach out to Animal Rescuers within the Municipalities to assist in spay/neuter, rehoming, being a vigilante within their residential community to promote RPO.
3. Promote SPCA's SFS Stray Free Selangor program with Royal Patron Tengku Permaisuri Selangor.
4. Conduct Workshops at SPCA Centre to promote RPO to pet owners and proper Shelter Management for Municipal council pound workers/staff.
5. Creating Community Shelters within Tamans.
6. Working with acceptable Communities to allow TNR dogs (ear tipped for easy verification) with an acceptable SOP where rescuers continue to feed, treat and manage this group for the well-being of the community animals and educate the community as well.
7. In commercial enterprises like property development and factories CCCC urges these commercial enterprises to be responsible and spay/neuter the dogs they use to guard their properties, and ensure their well-being.
